

Telephone Consultations

Project TEACH allows PCCs to immediately speak with child and adolescent psychiatrists and reproductive psychiatrists.

Ask questions, discuss cases, or review treatment options.

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Child and Adolescent Face-to-Face Evaluations

PCCs can also request face-to-face evaluations with child and adolescent psychiatrists for the children and families in their practices.

If a PCC's office would like to offer evaluations via telehealth, Project TEACH regional provider teams can work with him/her to make this service available.

Face-to-face evaluations occur within two weeks of requests. All face-to-face evaluations are followed by written reports within 2 days to the referring clinician.



Referrals and Linkages

Linkage and referral services help primary care clinicians and families access community mental health and support services. This includes clinic treatment, care management, or family support. Project TEACH will provide referrals to PCCs for children and adolescents as well as women with maternal mental health concerns.





Training

Project TEACH offers free, CME trainings in several different formats for Primary Care Clinicians (PCCs) serving children and adolescents as well as women with maternal mental health concerns. These programs support the clinician's ability to assess, treat and manage mild-to-moderate mental health concerns in their practices.





Intensive Trainings

Project TEACH also offers specialized, in-depth programs that offer up to 15 hours of CME credit. Offered twice each year, these trainings help pediatric primary care clinicians recognize, assess, and manage mild-to-moderate mental health concerns in children and adolescents.

- ★ On the Maternal Mental Health side, we will be offering two intensive trainings, offering up to 6 CME credits.





Core Trainings

Core trainings are led by teams from our hub sites and are offered on-site at PCC practices or at a nearby location. Core trainings offer CMEs and can be provided through a series of 2-3 hour sessions or in one longer program depending on PCC needs. Our hub teams cover assessment and management of the important mental health issues that children and adolescents face: ADHD, Anxiety, Depression and Trauma/Aggression.





Webinars

Project TEACH also offers **Five, 1-hour CME webinars annually** on a variety of child mental health topics above and beyond those covered in the Intensive and Core Trainings. Webinars will be offered live and recorded for posting on the website.

★ Three Maternal Mental Health webinars will also be offered annually.





Educational Resources

Project TEACH will produce **four educational resources annually** for parents and/or youth. These resources will be posted on the website, available freely to the public, and translated into the 6 most common languages.

Two Maternal Mental Health educational resources for women and families will also be developed annually and posted on the website..



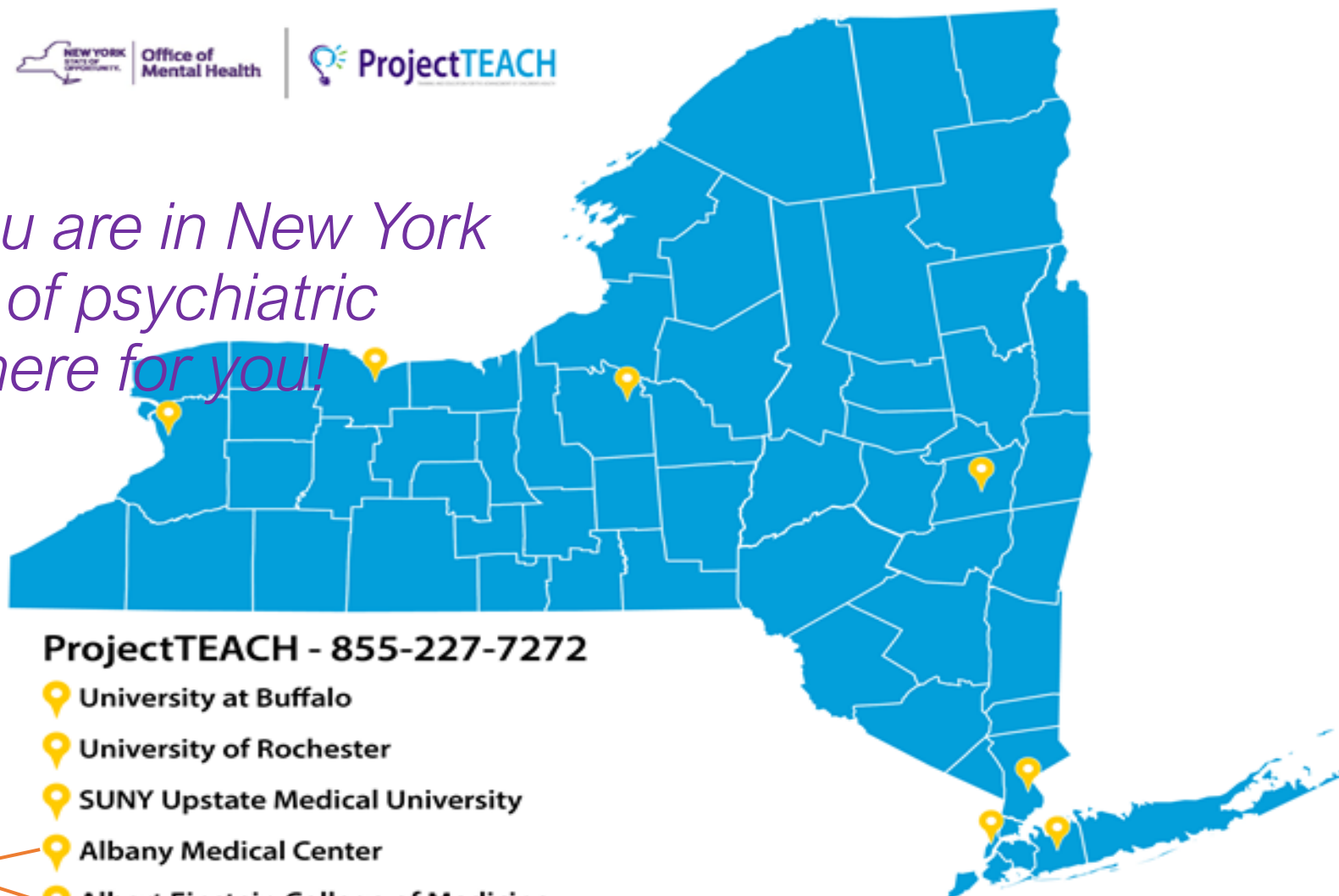

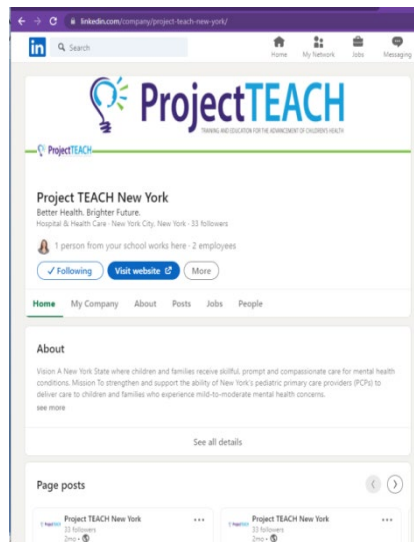
